



Statement Regarding the Use of Conflict Minerals

In July of 2010, the United States Congress passed legislation requiring corporations to report the use of “Conflict Minerals” in the manufacture of their products.

“Conflict Minerals” in this context refers to specific minerals originating from mines controlled by armed groups in the Democratic Republic of the Congo or adjoining countries.

The details of the legislation can be found in Section 1502 of HR 4173, signed into law on July 21, 2010.

Aztec Washer Company, Inc. is committed to complying with this legislation and plans to comply with forthcoming regulations to enable designation of all Aztec Washer Company, Inc. products as “Conflict Free”.

We are currently working with our suppliers to understand or establish their systems for sourcing of raw materials, including any listed metals which may be used in Aztec Washer Company, Inc.’s products.
